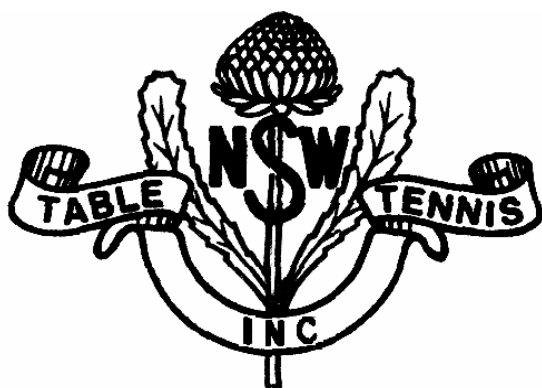

Presidents Report

On the occasion of my second AGM as President and reflecting on 2010, it could be argued that there have been many steps forward with some steps backwards.

Again, it has been a busy year; one that has concentrated on trying to grow the membership of the Association both in players and Affiliated Clubs. In both areas we have had some success with the number of Affiliated Members expanding, particularly in regional NSW, and the number of registered players within the various levels.

I am pleased to welcome the new Affiliates from Lake Macquarie East Table Tennis Club, Nambucca Heads Table Tennis Club, Seals Maroubra Beach Table Tennis Club, Far South Coast Table Tennis Club, Sydney Table Tennis Club and Northern Beaches Table Tennis Club.

Last year we took the step of introducing a new membership level, called "Social". When implementing this we were aware that it would impact on numbers in higher levels, but the prime aim was to gain growth in overall numbers.

The table below indicates the changes within the Levels between 2009 and 2010. The number of "pensioners" reduced, as we expected, because many only play within their Club. The drop in "Competition" level cannot be explained, as it is doubtful that people who previously played in tournament suddenly decided to reduce to "Social" members.

The highlight of 2010 was the excellent results of our entire representative players in national tournaments. For the first time in many years our players were at the top of the results, competing well against traditional winning States. The decision to host the Australian Open, which was held at the Gosford proved to be a great success, even though it did have a negative effect on our finances.

There was a lot of work undertaken by many to make the national championship a success, particularly the senior organising group lead by Phil Males, Ian Finlay, Ted Davis, ably assisted by Jan Davis, Stephen Gillespie, Graham Boyton and several others.

The Committee of the Central Coast Table Tennis Association should also be commended for their efforts in making these Championships a success.

However it is the players who deserve most of the credit, New South Wales was well represented and we should be very pleased with their results and efforts.

At this AGM we will see some additional new members joining the Directors and Executive. First I must thank David Beaumont for his long and continuous service to Table Tennis in this State and Nationally. Others are in a better position to tell David's story, but I must thank him for his loyal and supportive work while I have been President. However, like many of us, David believes it is time to allow new blood to be involved in our Association.

Phil Males, who stood down as Financial Director at the last AGM, is now standing down from the Directorship. Phil is another person who has been heavily involved in our State for many years. Of course Phil will remain closely associated with table tennis, as he is currently the TTA Vice President, and we believe he will continue in that role for another year. Also, Michelle Beaumont has decided not to stand at this AGM because of other commitments. I thank her for her efforts and look forward to seeing her participate again in the future.

I thank all the current Directors who have re-nominated and look forward to working with them in the coming year.

I would like to welcome as Vice President Elect, Guy Fainbloom. I see this as an important move to the "changing of the guard" over the next several years. I would also like to welcome the Directors Elect - Simon Leung, Tony Bo, Stephen Gillespie and Steve Bruton. I am sure they will make a good contribution to our progress in 2011 and beyond.

Last year I reported that we had been experimenting with new organisational structures, investigating new ideas for enhancing our administration and relations with our members and registered players. We are still looking at these initiatives and will be keen to make progress in this regard in the coming year.

One thing we did do in 2010 was seeing the introduction of the TTNSW Membership Card and the employment of Jason Lau to assist in the running of the office. It's been a steep knowledge ladder for Jason, and I believe that 2011 will see him take a more active role in the administration of TTNSW activities.

The TTNSW website and the on-line registrations for membership and tournaments was introduced in 2010 and have had some limited success. We plan to keep working on bringing the website up to date and be more interactive. We have changed some hosting arrangements and I also spent a lot of time in discussions with Sporting Pulse to have improvements made to the database. It was only in late 2010 that we have seen some of our requests implemented, so 2011 will allow us to make the site more relevant to members and affiliates.

I would encourage all members to regularly visit the site and make use of the on-line registrations.

The Loop, still remains an area in which I am not satisfied with. We will be looking to use Jason more to make this communication tool better used. Of course it would greatly assist us if registered players gave us up to date email addresses. The cost of stamps and sending mail is still rising.

Finally, I would again like to thank all Council and Executive members and particularly Ted, Jan and Jason, in the office, for their advice and goodwill over the past year. I believe that we will continue to develop this sport in the state and this can only be a benefit for our Affiliate members and players.

Table Tennis NSW had an excellent but demanding year in 2010 highlighted by our hosting of the Australian Open Championships at the Central Coast Association in Gosford

NSW fielded teams to all national championships in every age division.

The continuation of the National Training Centre has maintained the elite training programs enabling NSW Teams to Dominate the Australian Open Championships as evidenced by a Gold & Silver Medal in the Men's & Gold in the Women's with several in the Presidents teams also dominating.

The domination of the U13 girls was remarkable with our seven players winning Gold & Silver Medals. Even more remarkable were the results in the Girls Doubles where our girls won seven of the eight medals on offer.

We will continue to maintain the Elite training program for 2011 but in a revised format as the TTA funding will no longer be available. This will enable us to strive to maintain the same high performance at National Championships as was achieved in 2010 – congratulations to all players who represented NSW in 2010

COUNTRY LEAGUE REPORT

This year saw a change in leadership with long serving President, Alan Russell, looking to spend time travelling and Ken Sands from Port Macquarie taking over the role of President. As well as running the Country League Alan was heavily involved in the Illawarra Association.

Junior Coaching Clinics

The Country League is working towards Junior Coaching clinics being held in different geographical locations throughout 2011. It is hoped this will bring some high level coaching to those kids located in rural areas.

City versus Country – 20th March

The City versus Country event was held again on the Central Coast. City provided 21 players whilst Country had 59. It was decided that the players from Newcastle and the Central Coast would take on the City and remaining Country players. In a close encounter the combined City/Country teams won 145 rubbers to the Newcastle/Central Coasts 141 rubbers. At the Country Leagues Annual General Meeting it was decided that after poor attendance on the City side, for the second year, the event would be replaced by another Country League run tournament. Recent discussions with TTNSW may yet see this tournament continue.

Country areas represented were Illawarra, Kempsey Macleay, Nepean, Newcastle, Port Macquarie and the Central Coast.

Country Championships – 22nd & 23rd May

This event was held at the Central Coast Youth Club with a record 52 teams entered. The event is held over two days and is going from strength to strength. Along with the winning teams this year the best player in each division was recognised.

With the ACT and an invitational side, Country areas represented were Bathurst, Coffs Harbour, Far North Coast, Goulburn, Gulgong, Illawarra, Kempsey Macleay, Nepean, Newcastle, Orange, Port Macquarie and the Central Coast.

On a personal note, I must say that it has been an interesting year in terms of meeting and working with more officials from around the country and officiating at more tournaments.

We are looking forward to finding ways to increase the number of umpires available to officiate at State tournaments.

Director - Junior Development & Women - Report

Role as Junior Development Director

Due to some personal issues, I couldn't do much coaching at Homebush in 2010; I was mainly doing regular school coaching, plus the casual coaching for the schools kids arranged by the Sport Halls (organizer: Caroline Hocking).

The kids I coached are mainly beginner level, since they only have very limited time with me. My aim is to introduce our sport to them, at least teach them the three basics- serve, forehand & backhand stroke. I also aim to provide a bit of general knowledge for games, then off they go. I continue to receive a very pleasant reaction & feedback from kids & their teachers.

Meeting new school kids & teachers gave me a perfect opportunity to announce the State Open School Annual Competition to the students & their schools.

To increase the popularity of our sport in NSW schools is one of my priorities. Through my experience, in running the AASC (Active After School Activity) program, it is one of the bridges we can use to give the kids a taste of table tennis. We need to encourage more level one coaches to take on the free short course, and be prepared to be called out by the schools promoting our sport to them.

Role as Women Director

I attended an event called "Girls Get Active Breakfast" on 28th October at Homebush. There were around two **thousand** participants (officials, VIPs, guest speakers, and approx 70% are school girls & teachers...) at this successful event. People listened, received information and passionately joined the activities afterward.

There were about 12-15 different sports (some sports are modified to suit the hall condition) with their stores set up in the two halls, inviting school girls to try.

Similar events should be continually running in NSW, giving us a good opportunity to introduce our sport to the schoolgirls. Next year, we will need to have volunteer officials joining me, then we can really organize a table tennis store in the event that represents our sport!
